Dedication of Cornville Post Office Historic Markers: On Saturday, May 19 at 1 pm, Yavapai County Supervisor Chip Davis will dedicate two historic markers placed on the original sites of the Cornville Post Office. The signs are being installed on properties now owned by Windmill Gardens and Banker Insulation. Postmaster Charles S. Chick built his post office in 1909, on land now owned by Windmill Gardens. In 1914, he married Jessie M. Cox; and they moved the post office across the road to property now owned by Banker Insulation. There, they expanded the structure to include a residence. Charles and Jessie Chick served consecutively as Cornville Postmasters for over 50 years. The structure was sold and moved in the 1980's. The dedication will be held at Windmill Gardens; and Chick family members will be honorary guests. Refreshments will be served; and the public is invited. The Society hopes these markers will be the first of a series of historic markers to be placed, over time, in the Cornville/Page Springs area.

Eighth Annual Meeting Highlights: The Society's Annual Meeting was held on March 20, with 33 members and guests present. The business meeting included an annual progress report by Linda Allen Kappel highlighting the year's activities and accomplishments. The Society had 69 members in good standing (*those who have paid 2012 dues, honorary and business members*). Minor changes to Society bylaws, the 2011 Financial Report, and 2012 Proposed Budget were approved. The Society ended calendar year 2011 with \$6,283.82, due to successful fundraisers and increased membership. Board members Janet Cassagio, Judy Miller and Diana Stipek were re-elected for 2-year terms. Linda Allen Kappel and Dan Derrick will continue for one more year through March 2013. Guest speaker Bill Cowan, Verde Valley Historian and Author of "*Images of America: Verde Valley*", gave an excellent presentation, tracing the history of the Verde Valley from prehistoric times. The program was followed by a book signing opportunity, refreshments and socializing.

Charter Roster Now Complete: Cornville was established on July 9, 1885, with the naming of the community and its first postmaster; and the Cornville Historical Society was established 120 years later in 2005. As a result, the Society's founders decided that the first 120 members to join would be considered "charter members". This year, the Society reached its charter goal; so the Charter Roster will forever acknowledge the first 120 members who helped make the society a reality. Thanks to all for your support!

"History of the Cornville Post Office" Report Now Available: Facts and possibilities about Cornville's name, post office establishment, locations, and postmasters have all been compiled in a new 44-page report that includes both old and new information, stories, and photos that tell the story of Cornville's postal history over time. Included is the "most likely story" of how Cornville got its name; and early postmasters are featured in short vignettes. Since 1885, Cornville has had twelve postmasters who provided service from at least eight locations. A fascinating story of the oldest and longest-used post office and store, built by Charles Chick, is featured as Cornville's "Centennial" Post Office. From government records and other sources, research for the report was conducted via internet, mail, telephone and personal contacts. It included a trip to the National Archives in Washington, DC and interviews with former postal employees and others with memories to share. Still, the Cornville Historical Society always welcomes information that will clarify and add to its postal history.
