Want a Memorial Brick at the Old Post Office?






Old Roads in Cornville and Page Springs

Mike Spencer from Prescott shared a 1911 Map of Yavapai County with us. The map was drawn and copyrighted by J. William Waara, C. E. in Prescott Arizona. The description indicates the map was compiled from official and private records. An excerpt from the map, showing Cornville and Page Springs is shown below. The blue symbol was added to show the location of the Cornville Post Office in 1911. Can anyone tell us which roads are depicted in our area?
