Annual Progress Report

January 1 to December 31, 2023

OLD CORNVILLE POST OFFICE: Always a work in progress! Remember, you can walk up on the porch and look through the windows at the exhibits inside. As you walk to the porch on the Memorial Brick Walkway, note the names of friends and neighbors. Patrick Shamrell, Dan Derrick and Bob Snyder are the caretakers.

ANNUAL MEETING: The Society's Fifteenth Annual Meeting was held March 17, 2022, at Our Shepherd Lutheran Church. Following the business meeting, a program featured retired geologist Kip Williams, who gave a presentation about the world-famous Gypsum Caves in Naica Chihuahua, Mexico. The business meeting included annual reports, budget approval and election of officers. The Society also bid farewell to Janet & Stephen Cassagio, wishing them well in their new home in Florida. Refreshments and social time followed the program.

RESEARCH: Research of Cornville families, original land patent holders, and historic sites always continues. To research Cornville settlers, a "Cornville Family Tree" was created at www.ancestry.com by Janet Cassagio. Descendants of early Cornville settlers can use the tree to connect with the Society and exchange information.

OLLI PRESENTATION: On September 19, Judy Miller and Sharon Morehouse participated in the Yavapai College Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) series about Historical Societies in the Verde Valley. They presented a "Once Upon a Creek" power point presentation about the Society, focusing particularly on the history of Page Springs.

HOLIDAY FUNDRAISER: The Eleventh Annual Holiday Fundraiser was held on December 4, 2022, at Oak Creek Elementary School. Arizona Travel Writer and Author Roger Naylor, also a resident of the Verde Valley, gave an excellent power point presentation on "The Amazing Kolb Brothers of the Grand Canyon". About eighty attendees enjoyed Naylor's tales of their adventures and photography, along with the opportunity to purchase autographed copies of his books. After a break for refreshments and visiting, beautiful gift baskets were raffled off to lucky guests; and the event raised \$800. Thank you to everyone who came and supported the Society.

RECORDS MANAGEMENT: In January 2022, the Society rented a storage unit at Cornville Storage on Western Drive. Janet & Stephen Cassagio, Cindy & Bob Snyder and son, and Sharon Morehouse moved the files and equipment from Cassagio's home to the storage unit. In June 2022, Patrick Shamrell, Dan Derrick, and Sharon Morehouse moved more files and equipment from the Old Post Office into storage. Now, everything is together in one place! Permanent office and storage space--where the Society can meet, store its growing collection of records and items, and invite researchers—is still urgently needed.

MEMBERSHIP: In November, reminder letters were sent to all members, friends and business leaders inviting them to join or renew their memberships for CY 2023. As of February, there were 50 members in good standing, including 8 honorary; 39 paid (individuals & families); and 3 business memberships. Further outreach is underway to encourage more business participation.

CORNVILLE COURIER: Three issues of the "Cornville Courier" newsletter were issued in February, May, and November 2022.

WEBSITE: The <u>www.cornville-historical-society.org</u> website contains information about CHS mission and goals, membership, site inventories, oral histories, newsletters, publications and more! Judy Miller monitors the website for information requests and messages and updates the site when needed.
